



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORT DELAWARE SUMMARY

On September 4, 2024, **3** out of **4 (75%)** identified domestic violence programs in Delaware participated in a national count of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). During the 24-hour survey period, participating programs served **177** victims, did not have enough resources to meet **76** requests for help, and shared the following additional information.

177 Victims Served

88 adults and children found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, hotels, motels, or other housing provided by local programs.

89 adults and children received non-residential supportive services like transportation, court accompaniment, counseling, and more.

16 Hotline Contacts Received

Domestic violence hotlines are lifelines for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources via phone, chat, text, email, and more. Programs' hotlines received **16** contacts, averaging **nearly 1** contact per hour.

0 People Educated

While programs did not provide educational sessions during this period, addressing topics like domestic violence prevention and early intervention are important throughout the year.

76 Unmet Requests for Services

Victims made **76** requests for services that programs could not provide because they lacked sufficient resources, funding, and/or staffing. Approximately **43%** of these unmet requests were for emergency shelter, hotels, motels, transitional housing, and other housing.
