



# **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORT** NEW JERSEY SUMMARY

On September 4, 2024, **35** out of **38 (92%)** identified domestic violence programs in New Jersey participated in a national count of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). During the 24-hour survey period, participating programs served **1,334** victims, did not have enough resources to meet **187** requests for help, and shared the following additional information.

#### 1,334 Victims Served

**733** adults and children found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, hotels, motels, or other housing provided by local programs.

**601** adults and children received non-residential supportive services like transportation, court accompaniment, counseling, and more.

### **663 Hotline Contacts Received**

Domestic violence hotlines are lifelines for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources via phone, chat, text, email, and more. Programs' hotlines received **663** contacts, averaging **nearly 28** contacts per hour.

#### **498 People Educated**

Programs provided **12** educational sessions and trainings to **498** members of the public, addressing topics like domestic violence prevention and early intervention.

#### **187 Unmet Requests for Services**

Victims made **187** requests for services that programs could not provide because they lacked sufficient resources, funding, and/or staffing. Approximately **74%** of these unmet requests were for emergency shelter, hotels, motels, transitional housing, and other housing.
