



# **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORT**NEW MEXICO SUMMARY

On September 4, 2024, **23** out of **31 (74%)** identified domestic violence programs in New Mexico participated in a national count of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). During the 24-hour survey period, participating programs served **803** victims, did not have enough resources to meet **72** requests for help, and shared the following additional information.

#### **803 Victims Served**

**579** adults and children found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, hotels, motels, or other housing provided by local programs.

**224** adults and children received non-residential supportive services like transportation, court accompaniment, counseling, and more.

## 137 Hotline Contacts Received

Domestic violence hotlines are lifelines for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources via phone, chat, text, email, and more. Programs' hotlines received **137** contacts, averaging **nearly 6** contacts per hour.

## 83 People Educated

Programs provided **5** educational session or training to **83** members of the public, addressing topics like domestic violence prevention and early intervention.

## 72 Unmet Requests for Services

Victims made **72** requests for services that programs could not provide because they lacked sufficient resources, funding, and/or staffing. Approximately **29%** of these unmet requests were for emergency shelter, hotels, motels, transitional housing, and other housing.
