



# **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORT**OHIO SUMMARY

On September 4, 2024, **75** out of **75 (100%)** identified domestic violence programs in Ohio participated in a national count of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). During the 24-hour survey period, participating programs served **2,701** victims, did not have enough resources to meet **347** requests for help, and shared the following additional information.

#### 2,701 Victims Served

**1,621** adults and children found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, hotels, motels, or other housing provided by local programs.

**1,080** adults and children received non-residential supportive services like transportation, court accompaniment, counseling, and more.

### **636 Hotline Contacts Received**

Domestic violence hotlines are lifelines for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources via phone, chat, text, email, and more. Programs' hotlines received **636** contacts, averaging **nearly 27** contacts per hour.

### 992 People Educated

Programs provided **33** educational sessions and trainings to **992** members of the public, addressing topics like domestic violence prevention and early intervention.

## **347 Unmet Requests for Services**

Victims made **347** requests for services that programs could not provide because they lacked sufficient resources, funding, and/or staffing. Approximately **94%** of these unmet requests were for emergency shelter, hotels, motels, transitional housing, and other housing.
