



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORT PENNSYLVANIA SUMMARY

On September 4, 2024, **56** out of **60 (93%)** identified domestic violence programs in Pennsylvania participated in a national count of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). During the 24-hour survey period, participating programs served **3,184** victims, did not have enough resources to meet **483** requests for help, and shared the following additional information.

3,184 Victims Served

2,006 adults and children found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, hotels, motels, or other housing provided by local programs.

1,178 adults and children received nonresidential supportive services like transportation, court accompaniment, counseling, and more.

882 Hotline Contacts Received

Domestic violence hotlines are lifelines for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources via phone, chat, text, email, and more. Programs' hotlines received **882** contacts, averaging **nearly 37** contacts per hour.

395 People Educated

Programs provided **25** educational sessions and trainings to **395** members of the public, addressing topics like domestic violence prevention and early intervention.

483 Unmet Requests for Services

Victims made **483** requests for services that programs could not provide because they lacked sufficient resources, funding, and/or staffing. Approximately **41%** of these unmet requests were for emergency shelter, hotels, motels, transitional housing, and other housing.
