



# DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORT

## UTAH SUMMARY

On September 4, 2024, **14** out of **15 (93%)** identified domestic violence programs in Utah participated in a national count of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). During the 24-hour survey period, participating programs served **1,009** victims, did not have enough resources to meet **245** requests for help, and shared the following additional information.

### 1,009 Victims Served

**654** adults and children found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, hotels, motels, or other housing provided by local programs.

**355** adults and children received non-residential supportive services like transportation, court accompaniment, counseling, and more.

### 248 Hotline Contacts Received

Domestic violence hotlines are lifelines for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources via phone, chat, text, email, and more. Programs' hotlines received **248** contacts, averaging **more than 10** contacts per hour.

### 565 People Educated

Programs provided **17** educational sessions and trainings to **565** members of the public, addressing topics like domestic violence prevention and early intervention.

### 245 Unmet Requests for Services

Victims made **245** requests for services that programs could not provide because they lacked sufficient resources, funding, and/or staffing. Approximately **44%** of these unmet requests were for emergency shelter, hotels, motels, transitional housing, and other housing.
