Qualifications:

The Capacity Technical Assistance team requires applicants to demonstrate an interest in learning about non-profit organizations. Interest in domestic violence best practices, research, and grant implementation are a plus. Interested applicants must demonstrate:

- The ability to work independently in a fast-paced office, under tight deadlines;
- A commitment to ending domestic violence;
- Understanding of and commitment to diversity issues;
- Excellent written and oral communications skills;
- A good sense of humor; and
- Experience working with victims of domestic violence or on state or federal policy a plus.
- Experience working within grants or cooperative agreements a plus.

NNEDV internship applications are considered on a rolling basis.
