Monday – Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

What type of information will be provided to me?

- Safety planning
- Your legal rights in the criminal justice process
- Victim Compensation information
- Legal and domestic violence related resources in your community or other states
- How and where to file for an Order of Protection and your rights if violations occur
- What to expect during a hearing to Contest an Order of Protection
- Domestic violence, immigration and filing a self-petition for U.S. citizenship
- Divorce, legal separation, custody, and visitation
- Participating in the court system without an attorney
- Reporting domestic violence to law enforcement
- Safety planning and anti-stalking resources and information.
