NDCAWS/CASAND MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERSHIP

- 1. The **primary mission** of member organizations must be the provision of services to victims of domestic violence and/or sexual assault and their dependents.
- 2. A member organization must be a non-profit corporation or affiliated with one of the ND Tribes and must maintain a physical office in North Dakota.
- 3. Member organizations must state that they are willing to comply with the mission statement of NDCAWS/CASAND.
- 4. Member organizations are required to have a written policy of non-discrimination.
- 5. Member organizations must be committed to increasing public awareness about domestic violence and sexual assault and to providing viable solutions to address issues of violence.
- 6. A member organization must demonstrate a working relationship with the criminal justice system, with the school districts in its service area, and with the other supporting agencies in the counties it serves.
- 7. Member organizations must have served a minimum of 10 clients in the previous 6 months.
- 8. To prevent duplication of services, NDCAWS/CASAND will accept, for membership, only one organization per county, unless a special population exists to justify the necessity of another organization.
- 9. A minimum \$50 annual dues is required for membership.
- 10. Concerning victim services, member organizations must:
 - a. provide direct and immediate access to services through the operation of a 24-hour crisis line.
 - b. have a plan in place that guarantees **personal contact** between an advocate and a victim as quickly as possible after the victim has contacted the organization.
 - c. provide access to **emergency shelter/protective housing** through the use of a shelter facility or safe homes.
 - d. provide advocacy with information about and referrals to the following:
 - 1. Civil and criminal court systems
 - 2. Legal counsel
 - 3. Medical community
 - 4. Social Service financial assistance and support services
 - 5. Community self-help groups
 - 6. Mental health system
 - 7. Law enforcement agencies
 - e. provide peer support, and safety planning for victims.

- 11. Concerning training of staff and volunteers, member organizations must:
 - a. provide a minimum of 40 hours of training for all new staff prior to working with victims.
 - b. provide a minimum of 12 hours of pre-service training for volunteer advocates
 - c. include the following elements in training:
 - 1. orientation
 - 2. on the job training/supervision
 - 3. in-service training
 - 4. an evaluation process
 - d. provide on-going staff training opportunities through:
 - 1. workshops
 - 2. CAWS/CASAND q meetings
 - 3. informal information sharing
 - e. utilize a staff performance evaluation process
