- · coordinated entry,
- · screening potential housing clients,
- connecting survivors to resources and housing,
- mediating landlord/tenant issues,
- issuing rental payments each month,
- · client case management services,
- working with clients to navigate programs
- other duties as assigned including administrative tasks in support of various programs
- some travel required (in-state and out-of-state)

Candidates should:

- hold a deep commitment to gender, economic, and racial justice for all.
- enjoy collaboration and being part of a dynamic, highly productive and integrated team; maintain flexibility and effectively manage ambiguity in a responsive work environment.
- be self-motivated, resourceful, creative, independent, and able to work without significant day-to-day supervision.
- be open to giving and receiving feedback and practice this regularly.
- believe in working toward progressive policies to create a new vision for our future.
- enjoy working with diverse staff and board in an organization committed to social justice.
