



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS Virgin Islands Summary

On September 13, 2018, 1 out of 2 (**50%**) identified domestic violence programs in the U.S. Virgin Islands participated in the National Census of Domestic Violence Services. The following figures represent the information provided by this 1 participating program about services provided during the 24-hour survey period.

19 Victims Served in One Day

8 domestic violence victims found refuge in emergency shelters or transitional housing provided by local domestic violence programs.

11 adults and children received non-residential assistance and services, including counseling, legal advocacy, and children’s support groups.

8 Hotline Calls Answered

Domestic violence hotlines are a lifeline for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources. In the 24-hour survey period, hotline staff in the U.S. Virgin Islands answered on average 1 hotline call every two hours.
