



# DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORT GUAM SUMMARY

On September 12, 2019, 4 out of 4 **(100%)** identified domestic violence programs in Guam participated in a national census of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). The following figures represent the information shared by these 4 participating programs regarding the services provided during DV Counts Day, the 24-hour survey period.

### 27 Victims Served in One Day

27 adult and child victims of domestic violence found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, or other housing provided by local domestic violence programs.

0 adult and child victims received non-residential assistance and services, including counseling, legal advocacy, children’s support groups, and more.

### 8 Hotline Calls Answered

Domestic violence hotlines are a lifeline for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources. During the 24-hour survey period, local hotline staff in Guam answered 8 calls.

- ❖ Our agency successfully helped a survivor in obtaining required documents, scheduling housing orientation, and registering for assistance for permanent housing. They are now first on the list to receive housing.
