



# DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORT

## NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS SUMMARY

On September 9, 2021, **1** out of **1 (100%)** identified domestic violence programs in the Northern Mariana Islands participated in a national count of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). In 2021, frontline advocates continued to navigate unforeseen challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic and other crises. The following figures represent the information shared by the participating program about the services they provided during the 24-hour survey period.

### 59 Victims Served in One Day

**59** adult and child victims of domestic violence found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, hotels, motels, or other housing provided by a local domestic violence program.

### 1 Hotline Contact Received

Domestic violence hotlines are lifelines for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources via phone, chat, text, and email. Hotline staff received **1** contact.

### 0 Unmet Requests for Services

While program staff were able to meet all of victims' needs during the survey period and did not report any unmet requests, there is still a tremendous need for increased funding to ensure programs can provide comprehensive services to all survivors seeking help while working toward preventing violence in their communities.
