PARTNERSHIPS

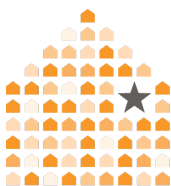
Developing partnerships with a domestic violence organization will be key to successfully supporting survivors. Partnerships should be sustainable and constantly evaluated.

SAFETY PLANNING

A safety plan is a living document developed with a survivor to address their safety concerns. A plan may include important phone numbers, what to do if they need to flee, and where important documents are stored. Each plan is unique to the survivor creating it.

DISCUSS

Take a moment when meeting with clients to discuss domestic violence and share information. This is an opportunity for folks to disclose any experiences of violence and for you to help.
