

# Tracking subrecipient awards for compliance with the FVPSA Formula requirements

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## What are the FVPSA Formula Requirements?



- States must ensure that at least 70% of funds are awarded to eligible programs that provide shelter and supportive services
- States must ensure that at least 25% of funds are awarded to eligible programs for supportive services and prevention services
- States must not keep more than 5% for administrative costs associated with administering the FVPSA grant(s)
  - Note: A state is not required to use the full 5%, which is why the other two categories each refer to minimums.

## Where does the 70/25/5 split come from?



#### Found in FVPSA statute:

- 42 U.S.C. §10406 Formula grants to States
- 42 U.S.C. §10408 Subgrants and uses of funds
- Also found in the <u>FVPSA State Funding Opportunity</u> <u>Announcement</u> (FOA)

## Which FVPSA funding streams does the 70/25 split apply to?



- Your "regular" FVPSA funding
- Your FY 2021 Family Violence Prevention and Services Act American Rescue Plan Supplemental Funding
  - i.e. the first round of ARP
- Not applicable under FVPSA American Rescue Plan COVID-19 Testing, Vaccines, and Mobile Health Units Supplemental funding
  - However, the 5% state administrative costs apply to every FVPSA funding stream



### What does this look like?

- Your total award X 0.70= Total <u>minimum</u> amount to be awarded to eligible entities for the purpose of Shelter and Supportive services
  - Example: Your grant is \$1,432,338 X 0.70=\$1,002,636.60
- Your total award X 0.25=Total <u>minimum</u> amount to be awarded to eligible entities for the purpose of Supportive services and prevention services
  - Example: Your grant is \$ 1,432,338 X 0.25=\$358,084.50
- Your total award X 0.05=Total <u>maximum</u> amount for States to keep for administrative costs
  - Example: Your grant is \$ 1,432,338 X 0.05=\$71,616.90






### Wait, there is more math?

Once you have determined your calculations for the budget period, you will then need to

consider:

- Match
  - For "regular" FVPSA funding only
- Your state's formula





### What about subrecipients?

- Note: The Formula requirements of utilizing 70% of the funding for shelter and supportive services and 25% of the funding for supportive services and prevention services does NOT apply to subrecipients
- The FVPSA statute specifically refers to the distribution of funding by the State (see Slide 15 for details), and does NOT specify any requirements for subrecipients
- States should ensure they are not passing down a State requirement to subrecipients when creating their RFP's and/or contracts/awards

### How do I track the formula?



The annual Performance Progress Report
 (PPR) tracks this for you via the subawardee

#### list

#### SP - State Portion

Information on FVPSA grants/funds awarded should include any funds awarded by the state during the federal fiscal year reporting period. For example, if during the past federal fiscal year (Oct- Sep), the State made awards to subawardees in July, then the State should report on the grants and funds awarded in July and any other funds awarded during the federal fiscal year reporting period. The State's aggregate report of services provided by FVPSA subawardees should include all services/grant activities that occurred throughout the federal fiscal year reporting period (Oct – Sep).

[Total funds awarded to subgrantees by the State: Report the total amount of grant awards or contracts made to subgrantees (i.e., domestic violence programs) during the reporting period.]

- You will notice that the PPR tracking method is only after the award period has ended
- You may want to create a pre-award tracking method to assist you with:
  - Self-monitoring
    - See 45 CFR 75.342(a)
  - Audit purposes

- Remember, FVPSA Statute requires a 20% match for most funded subrecipients
- The only exception is when you are directly funding Tribes or tribal consortiums
- Tribal organizations (as defined by 25 U.S.C. § 5304) are not exempt and must provide match

## Statutory and Regulatory References



### FVPSA Statute at 42 U.S.C. §10406 (b)(1)



### (b) Administrative expenses

#### (1) Administrative costs

Each State may use not more than 5 percent of the grant funds for State administrative costs.

## FVPSA Statute at <u>42 U.S.C.</u> §10408(b)(2):



#### (2) Shelter and supportive services

Not less than 70 percent of the funds distributed by a State under subsection (a) shall be distributed to entities for the primary purpose of providing immediate shelter and supportive services to adult and youth victims of family violence, domestic violence, or dating violence, and their dependents, as described in paragraph (1)(A). Not less than 25 percent of the funds distributed by a State under subsection (a) shall be distributed to entities for the purpose of providing supportive services and prevention services as described in subparagraphs (B) through (H) of paragraph (1).

## FVPSA Statute at <u>42 U.S.C.</u> §10406(c)(4):



#### (4) Match

No grant shall be made under this section to any entity other than a State or an Indian tribe unless the entity agrees that, with respect to the costs to be incurred by the entity in carrying out the program or project for which the grant is awarded, the entity will make available (directly or through donations from public or private entities) non-Federal contributions in an amount that is not less than \$1 for every \$5 of Federal funds provided under the grant. The non-Federal contributions required under this paragraph may be in cash or in kind.



### State FOA Match description:

Found under <u>Section II, Federal Award Information: Match</u> on pages 11-12:

A tribe as defined in 42 U.S.C. §10402(5), or tribal consortium comprised of tribes, is exempt from the match requirement under the FVPSA State Grant Program. Any entity other than a state or Indian tribe that receives FVPSA funding as a sub-recipient to provide the services specified in 42 U.S.C. 10408(b)(1)(A) – (H) (including training and technical assistance), must provide no less than a 20 percent match. State domestic violence coalitions, tribal coalitions, and tribal organizations (as defined by 25 U.S.C. § 5304) are not exempt and must provide match.





## § 75.342 Monitoring and reporting program performance.

(a) Monitoring by the non-Federal entity. The non-Federal entity is responsible for oversight of the operations of the Federal award supported activities. The non-Federal entity must monitor its activities under Federal awards to assure compliance with applicable Federal requirements and performance expectations are being achieved. Monitoring by the non-Federal entity must cover each program, function or activity. See also § 75.352. [emphasis added]



### 25 U.S.C. § 5304

 (I)"Tribal organization" or "tribal organization" means the recognized governing body of any Indian tribe; any legally established organization of Indians which is controlled, sanctioned, or chartered by such governing body or which is democratically elected by the adult members of the Indian community to be served by such organization and which includes the maximum participation of <u>Indians</u> in all phases of its activities: Provided, That in any case where a contract is let or grant made to an organization to perform services benefiting more than one Indian tribe, the approval of each such Indian tribe shall be a prerequisite to the letting or making of such contract or grant;
