



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COUNTS REPORTNORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS SUMMARY

On September 6, 2023, **1** out of **1 (100%)** identified domestic violence programs in the Northern Mariana Islands participated in a national count of domestic violence services conducted by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV). The following figures were shared by participating programs about the services they provided during the 24-hour survey period.

31 Victims Served

31 adult and child victims of domestic violence found refuge in emergency shelters, transitional housing, hotels, motels, or other housing provided by local programs.

While no victims received non-residential supportive services on the survey day, these essential services still require funding to keep them available all year long.

3 Hotline Contacts Received

Domestic violence hotlines are lifelines for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources via phone, chat, text, email, and more. Programs' hotlines received **3** contacts.

O People Educated

While programs did not provide educational sessions during this period, addressing topics like domestic violence prevention and early intervention are important throughout the year.

O Unmet Requests for Services

While programs did not report any unmet requests during this period, there is still a tremendous need for increased funding to ensure programs can provide comprehensive services to all survivors seeking help while working toward preventing violence in their communities.
