



WomensLaw at a Glance: 2025 National Updates

[WomensLaw.org](#) offers plain-language legal information for 55 states and territories, federal legal information, and non-legal information related to domestic violence. To provide the most updated information to survivors, their loved ones, and the professionals who help them, the WomensLaw team reviewed amendments to **479 statutes** and added **352 statutes** in 2025. Based largely upon these new and amended statutes, we created **536 new questions and responses** and revised an additional **930 existing questions and responses** on WomensLaw.org. We also translated **1,082 pieces of content** into Spanish and **3** into Korean. In our [Places that Help](#) section, we added **352 new state-specific and national resources** and updated **1,944 existing ones**.

Abuse Using Technology

With help from NNEDV's Safety Net team, we rewrote 7 sections of our [Abuse Using Technology](#) page, with more to come. Updated topics include electronic surveillance, GPS monitoring, computer crimes, and options to respond to technology misuse.

Forms of Abuse

We expanded our [Emotional and Psychological Abuse](#) section to address topics that WomensLaw Email Hotline users have asked about, including narcissism, blame-shifting by the abuser, and using others to cause harm. In partnership with [Esperanza United](#), we also created a new section on [Spiritual Abuse](#) to help victims identify this type of abuse.

Making Information More Accessible

We translated 1,082 pieces of content into Spanish, including legal information, court processes, and programs that help survivors, and we fully translated four states. Additionally, in partnership with [Esperanza United](#), we held bilingual webinars for advocates on family dynamics, child survivors, and navigating WomensLaw.org.

Preparing for Court

We updated our page on [Choosing and Working with a Lawyer](#) to provide survivors with information about what to consider when hiring a lawyer, and how to manage that relationship. We also created 3 new [Quick Guides](#) in English, Spanish, and Korean to help survivors navigate court proceedings and understand legal processes.
